Back to School (with a hearing loss)

Starting college can be tough. But what's tougher is starting college with a hearing loss. This time around, your only advocate is yourself – unless you're lucky enough to have a knowledgeable college disability service provider.

In this newsletter, we're listing some essential college accommodations. These products level the playing field so that you can live in a dorm, succeed in the classroom, and stay connected outside the classroom.

Living in a dorm means you need to hear the alarm clock, doorbell, phone ring, phone conversations, and fire alarm. Also, hearing TV news and weather is more of a security factor than a pastime. Inside the classroom, it goes without saying that you need to hear the professor. Outside the classroom, your life is less complicated if you can hear on a cell phone.

Hearing in the Dorm: Alertmaster AM6000K

The Alertmaster AM6000K is a good alarm clock, wireless doorbell, and phone signaler all in one. We like it because it is portable. Use it at school, home, or when traveling.

Place the base system in your bedroom near a phone outlet. Mount the battery operated wireless doorbell button. Then, plug in a lamp and the bedshaker. If you are awake, your lamp flashes. If you are asleep, the bedshaker vibrates and alerts you to the phone, doorbell or alarm clock. The lighted icons and distinct vibrating patterns help identify which signaler is activated.

If your dorm bed has a plywood bed frame, place the bedshaker on a folded towel. Or, keep the bedshaker on top of the mattress under the fitted sheet.

Sonic Boom Alarm Clock

The Sonic Boom alarm clock wakes you to the alarm clock and to other sounds (like the doorbell) when you use Sonic Alert components. The clock has one outlet to plug your lamp into and another to plug in the optional bed vibrator. This clock includes battery back-up and snooze alarm. You choose how you want to wake up: loud alarm (you adjust volume and tone); lamp flashing; and/or bed shaker.

Sweetheart Clock

This is a heart shaped hot pink alarm clock with multi-colored display. It has a bedshaker and a flashing alarm light. One-year warranty.

This phone includes a 2.5 mm headset jack and 3.5 mm neckloop jack. It has a vibrating handset ringer and visual ring signaler in both the handset and the base. Battery backup. One-year warranty.

Silent Call Fire Alarm Transmitter

The fire alarm company can connect this transmitter to an existing fire alarm system inside the dorm building. The Silent Call fire alarm transmitter transmits a signal up to 100 feet to a Silent Call remote receiver inside the dorm room (receiver separate).

This new infra-red TV listening system operates with Clarity Power Technology (Clarity Power technology helps make speech clearer, not just louder). Other nice benefits: It notifies you when the phone is ringing. The C120 is also compatible with most public infrared systems used in movie theaters. You can bring your headset along and hear the movie. (Transmits stereo sound up to 50 dB).

Hearing the Professor: Personal FM Systems

The first FM system is designed for those with moderate hearing loss and the second is designed for those with severe hearing loss. Both systems can be used with or without hearing aids:

1. Williams Sound PFM 350 (moderate hearing loss).

This system is equipped with an environmental microphone on the receiver. This microphone allows you to hear those close around you as well as the professor's voice coming from the transmitter. The complete system includes transmitter with omni-directional lapel microphone, receiver with earbud and built-in environmental microphone, disposable batteries and nylon carrying case. 5-year warranty. Other listening options are available.

2. Comtek 216 MHz (severe hearing loss).

The Comtek is an excellent FM system. You'll notice its clarity and power. It's clear because it operates on the less saturated 216 MHz band. It's powerful and gives a sound boost to your neckloop. The complete system includes:

- Transmitter with lapel microphone
- Receiver with a plug-in Smart-Mic environmental microphone
- Neckloop/Single earphone/Auxiliary input cord
- Disposable and Rechargeable batteries/battery charger kit
